Pew Sheet reflection on Luke 1:39-45 (46-55)

Some people who think that the church should be more directly engaged with secular politics might see Mary's song of praise almost as a socialist manifesto. However, Mary's humility, her obedience and her faithful surrender to God's will reminds us that it is God alone who can ultimately bring about a just society. Rather than empower the church as some kind of political power player we can trust that God seeks to accomplish this through the example of Jesus and the community of faith, the church. By its quality of life, its compassionate ministry, its service and all it stands for in the world, the church can bear witness to this.
