Reading: Luke 2: 41-end

⁴¹ Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. ⁴² And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. 43 When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. 44 Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. 45 When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. ⁴⁶ After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷ And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸ When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' 49 He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must

be in my Father's house?' ⁵⁰ But they did not understand what he said to them. ⁵¹ Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart.

Pew Sheet reflection on Luke 2: 41 - end

Losing a child in a crowd is every parent's nightmare. My wife once lost our 5-year old boy in a very large, crowded and busy supermarket. Panic stations, but eventually she found him at the lost property point to where he had confidently made his way and where he was cheerfully enjoying the doting attention of the staff. He knew where he was. Joseph and Mary thought they'd lost their boy but Jesus knew where he was. He was not lost but found. Found not in stimulating intellectual debates about the scriptures but in fascination that through the scriptures God made known his divine will, a divine will he was to know more and more in his earthly life. In reading scripture not only with the head but importantly with the heart, and prayerfully in the spirit, God speaks to us through scripture too.
