Reading: Matthew 4: 12-23

¹² Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. ¹³ He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the lake, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, ¹⁴ so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

¹⁵ 'Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles— ¹⁶ the people who sat in darkness

have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.'

¹⁷ From that time Jesus began to proclaim,

'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.'

¹⁸ As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' ²⁰ Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ²¹ As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. ²² Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed him. ²³ Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

Reflection on Matthew 4: 12-23

The powerful imagery that we read in John's gospel continues here. "The people who sat in darkness have seen a great light." This seems to resonate even more on these wintery days and with the news so full of conflict and devastation. Thank goodness for the prospect of light today however dim it must seem for so many. Jesus's choice of followers is interesting and instructive. They were working class men with no religious authority or influence. Therein of course lies their attraction to Jesus. It says something about the aura surrounding Jesus that they left and followed him so readily to become fishers of men (and women.) How might we have reacted to the invitation? It would be easy to think that we would probably have found reasons not to do so positively but I wonder if Jesus's presence would have made following him simply irresistible. I like to think it would
