Reading: Matthew 17: 1-9

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves.² And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white.³ Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him.⁴ Then Peter said to Jesus, 'Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.'⁵ While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, 'This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!'⁶ When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear.⁷ But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Get up and do not be afraid.'⁸ And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

⁹ As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, 'Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead.'

Reflection on Matthew 17: 1-9

The transfiguration is recounted in Luke and Mark's gospels as well as in Matthew's and together they give us a little more detail of this extraordinary event, particularly the disciple's reactions. These include fear, awe and a forlorn bid by Peter to build tents to somehow prolong the moment. When it is all over, the disciples come down off the mountain and are bidden not to speak of or maybe somehow hang onto their experience. They return from the extraordinary to the ordinary but they will have many, many more experiences of the divine presence of God in their ongoing journey with Jesus. Perhaps this reminds us not to place too much of a premium on having or even seeking special 'mountain-top' spiritual encounters with God. We meet, see, hear and experience the extraordinary God in our journey with Jesus in the very ordinariness of everyday life. That is just as special and wonderful enough.
